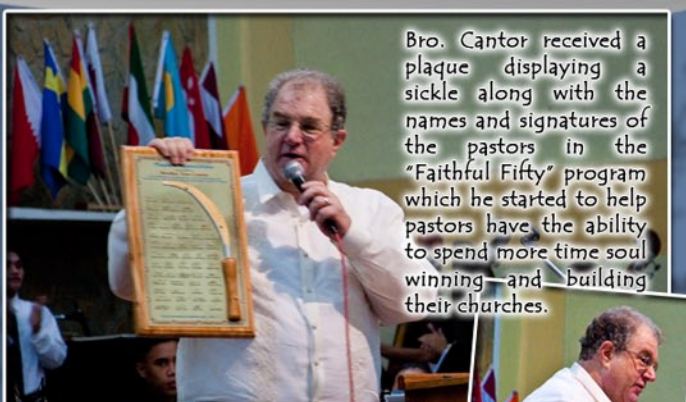
IN HIS STEPS

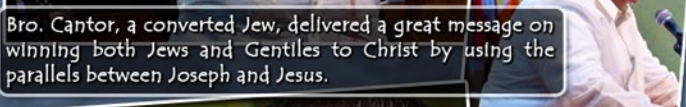

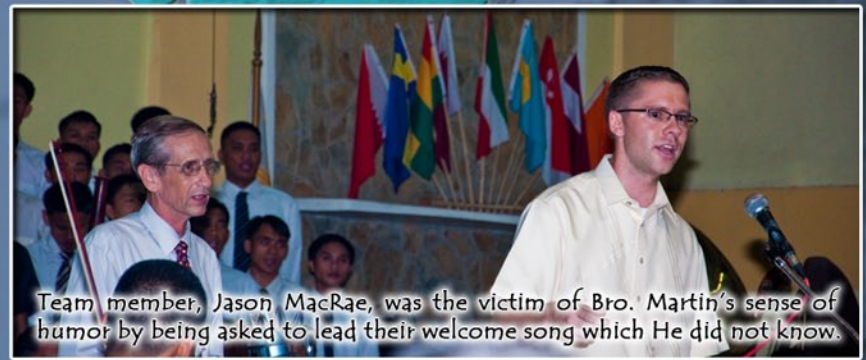
Bro. Cantor, a converted Jew, delivered a great message on winning both Jews and Gentiles to Christ by using the parallels between Joseph and Jesus.
